

Walsham Grange

May 2024

In May 2024 we visited Walsham Grange to speak with the people who live there about their experience with the home. We also spoke to some members of staff about their experiences. This visit formed part of our targeted engagement of visiting care homes around Norfolk to learn more about the experiences of people. When all the visits are complete a summary report will be produced.

Walsham Grange is a care home in North Walsham, a Norfolk town 15 miles north of Norwich and 5 miles west of the coast.

At the time of our visit Walsham Grange had 49 people living there. The home is registered for 75 with the actual capacity at 60 or 61 (as there are some double rooms). Most people living there are Local Authority funded and living with Dementia.

We were given a tour of the extensive building (served by several staircases and a lift) which is over two floors. Corridors are mostly wide and easily navigable and doors to rooms are brightly decorated. People living at Walsham Grange are encouraged to personalise their rooms with pictures and furniture of their choosing. Most of the rooms have en-suite facilities. We were shown a vacant room which was neutral and clean. There are rooms on both floors, with availability and the individual's needs influencing who lives where. The rooms are equipped with alarms to summon a member of staff.





Healthwatch Norfolk Officers who visited Walsham Grange noted:

The home has a dedicated salon, and a hairdresser visits every Monday. A local doctor visits twice a week and people can sign themselves up to be seen. There is a Catholic service once a month, and other denominations and faiths can be catered for.

There is a courtyard style outdoor space, largely hard standing, with seating and tables, and planters.



Daily activities include conversations about people's pasts, and quizzes. One person we met enjoyed doing the crosswords of the daily papers. There was a television lounge



and other quieter areas. There was a room made up to have the look of a pub. The home is also visited by young singing groups. There are two members of staff that have responsibility for activities and well-being.



All members of staff were professional, kind and welcoming. The manager told us about the importance of person-centred care at the home, both in terms of looking after the people that live there and managing members of staff.

From this visit we received six reviews for the home. We received three reviews from people who live there and three from members of staff. The average score is 4.6 out of 5.
