

## **Halsey House**

## October 2024

In October 2024 we visited Halsey House to speak with service users about their experience with the home. We also spoke to some members of staff about their experiences. This visit formed part of our targeted engagement of visiting care homes around Norfolk to learn more about the experiences of service users.

Halsey House is a residential and care home in Cromer, a coastal town in North Norfolk. The home can provide residential/nursing care for up to 76 people and dementia-specific care for up to 16 people (in an adjacent building, Danbury Lodge). Halsey House receives people whose care is funded by local councils, the healthcare system, and privately. There are currently ten Norfolk County Council funded residents. Each room is en-suite with shower facilities. There are several separate bathrooms across the site.

Halsey House is currently at 90% capacity and is looking to re-open the the day care provision as soon as possible.

On an average day there are twelve care staff across the main buildings and five in Danbury Lodge. There are four activity staff, five housekeeping, five catering and four maintenance.

From this visit we received seven reviews for the home. We received five reviews from service users, one from a volunteer and one from a visitor. These reviews have an average star rating of 4.8 out of five.



Healthwatch Norfolk Officers who visited Halsey House noted:

The Danbury Lodge unit is a colourful, welcoming space with large rooms. Corridor walls are decorated brightly and with themes to evoke memories and help residents orientate through the space. There are activity areas, including a shop that residents help to run.



The main buildings serve residential and nursing residents over two floors. The corridors are bright, clean and decorated with posters and artifacts that evoke memories and make the setting feel homely. Each room is spacious, clean and decorated to residents tastes. Halsey House uses a "silent alarm" system. Each resident has a personal device which alerts staff handsets.



There is a large, bright, newly refurbished main dining area and several smaller satelite dining rooms. Residents have the choice of where to eat. There is a varied menu on a fortnightly rotation. There are several social spaces, including a bar, bright conservatories and an art room. One corridor serves as an art gallery. Other activities include carpet bowls, bingo, crafts, a weekly knitting group and exercises. There is a non denominational service each Sunday. There is a hairdressing salon with a visiting hairdresser once a week. Outside there are large lawn and patio areas plus residents are invited to watch cricket at the neighbouring Cromer Cricket Club. Halsey House owns a minibus and trips are taken throughout the year, including the Norfolk Show, RAF Marham, Sandringham and coastal drives. Local school children visit to sing to residents at Christmas and the home holds events in the summer, at Halloween and at Christmas.





The service users we spoke to were happy living in the home and felt well cared for. They were happy with the activities on offer. Much praise was given to staff, and we heard how they were kind, friendly, and hard working.

Three service users mentioned that the food was improving.
