
In March 2025 we visited The Limes to speak with residents and relatives about their experience with the home. This visit formed part of our ongoing targeted engagement of visiting care homes around Norfolk to learn more about the experiences of the people that live there.

The Limes is a care home in Hellesdon, Norwich. The home provides residential care for 41 (up to 46) people aged 65 or over, mostly funded by Norfolk County Council. It was reported that most of the rooms are ensuite.

Healthwatch Norfolk Officers who visited The Limes noted:

The home was clean with a mixture of furnishings. Effort had gone into making the environment welcoming and comfortable. The home is on one level as an extended bungalow. The various extensions to the building have created a somewhat maze-like feel to the home, but there was dementia friendly signage to negate this. There were lots of photographs of residents on the walls. The shared lounge area was spacious and looked out onto a secure garden. There were other outside spaces with views from several locations, giving parts of the home a very light and airy feel.





The staffing is reported to be six staff and two senior staff in the day and three staff and one senior staff at night, plus administrative staff. At lunch time there is a "down tools hour" where administrative staff help the care staff.


There is currently one activity co-ordinator, although management told us that they hope to have two more recruited soon to cover all seven days. Just having the one activity co-ordinator currently was brought up by some residents negatively. Currently there are several activities on offer, including balloon tennis, quizzes, brain games, bingo, baking, and gardening. One resident reported that they really looked forward to the weekly quiz.

The menu is on a four weekly rotation and always offers at least two choices for each meal. Food is offered first on sample plates so that residents can see what they are having. Residents are involved in the menu choices.

There is a resident and relative quarterly meeting. One relative mentioned that they were not aware of it.

The residents we spoke to were mainly happy living in the home and felt well cared for. They were happy with the food and activities on offer. We heard how staff were kind, friendly, and approachable.

During the visit there were some loud alarms sounding, and this seemed to be agitating some of the residents.

256677	The staff are very pleasant	I've been here about five months. I've found it alright; very good! The staff are very pleasant. They look after me. The food is good. I can't say I always like it but there is a choice of two options. More times than often there is a choice that I like. I like the cottage pie! My room is always clean and tidy. I've got some family photos in there. I'm comfortable in there. I spend my time sort of half and half, in my room and in the lounge. Sometimes there is a quiz, a trivia quiz. I like that. I come every day and I do see staff saying to people "I'll be back in 2 minutes" but they're not, it can be 10-15 minutes or sometimes not at all. I sometimes think they might be understaffed. They've been without an events coordinator for a while. My wife has a nice room with a garden view, and she joins in with the activities. As a relative I don't feel that involved, I didn't know about the residents and relatives meeting, perhaps I missed that. If I knew about it, I would probably come. They do events, like a fair in the summer and a Mother's Day lunch. I'm impressed with the food here. I sometimes stay and have a meal. Generally, I'm happy with the care here.	4	Relative
